The restful habitat celebrating natural beauty, 'rewilding' and the connection between South Korea and Laos were the underlying drivers of the aesthetic and designs.

The color palette matches the interiors with brown (wood/bark/soil), and white (mist on the Song River).

The *Hanoak* motif was adapted from the cross-hatched lattice mid-section of a *pulpalgimum*.




Bearing in mind the Tmark logo and the forms from the buildings such as the tile mosaic, exclusive motifs were developed, and set in the "Stepped square" pattern as seen in Indian semiology, Lan Na architecture, Ayutthaya textiles and Siamese chintz or "Pha-Lai-Yang".

Specific fabric codes were used to depict the facets of Vang Vieng, Laos and Mekong lands, especially bamboo, karst and rivers.

The designs adapted codes from the M&S Saeng, Whiter Shade of Pale, Palanquin and Savan collections.

Natural hand spun yarn Tai Lue Gold cotton was sourced from M&S Outgrower Program villages.

The fabric was hand woven over three months at Hor Tamhuk, Vientiane and at M&S Home Weaver Program villages.



Care


Dry clean or hand wash only.

Protect dyed fabric from direct sunlight as natural yarns and dyes may change in shape and fade over time.

Tmark does not repair or replace any item damaged by incorrect care or due to natural causes.



M&S tests all yarns for composition at Intertek international labs and shrinks fabric in line with the American Association of Textile Chemists and Colorists standards
